


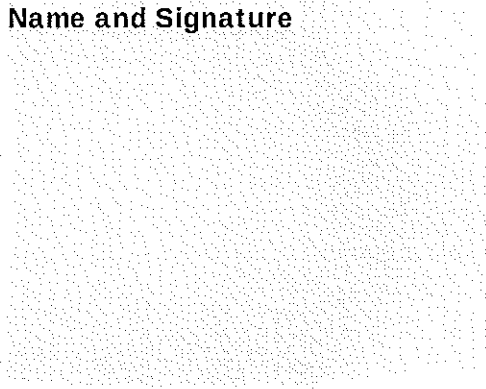

My main issue/s with the current vegetation management framework is:	<p>Overly complex process to obtain a development application/permit for vegetation management</p> <p>The length of time taken to obtain a development approval/permit for vegetation management</p> <p>The length of time to utilise a permit/development approval is too short (currently 5 years) and doesn't allow for long-term property planning</p> <p>Over-administration or administration of vegetation management by inexperienced departmental staff</p> <p>differing interpretations of the act and regulations by department staff</p>
