I am writing in response to the call for submissions for the Inquiry into the Electrical Safety and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2025 (the Bill).



We continue to advocate for the repeal of the *Work Health and Safety and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2024*. It includes ill-considered changes that were rushed through by the previous government, which we believe shifted Queensland further away from the national model work health and safety laws.
