I regularly see underage riders, people not wearing helmets, and scooters left dumped across pathways. I strongly believe there should be fines for speeding on footpaths, no matter the rider's age. If you're using public paths, there needs to be some accountability. Some suggestions:

- Clear speed limits and proper enforcement on footpaths.
- Fines for anyone riding recklessly age shouldn't be an excuse.
- Better parking and management of shared scooters.
- More education and signage so everyone understands the rules. I'm all for reducing car use
 and supporting greener transport, but it needs to be done safely especially in areas where
 families walk, play, and live.
