Scooters should all be fitted with a microchip, similar to a dog-tag or cat-chip. Speed cameras should be located along footpaths (especially along the beachfront) and equipped with tag-readers, such that speeding scooters can be identified, filmed and the scooter owner fined. Scooter hire companies must hold a deposit from scooter hirers which will be used towards paying any speeding fines, or refunded to hirer after, say 2 days, after camera footage and excess speeds have been sent to the scooter owner. Speed limit signs must be erected along footpaths, indicating max 10km/hr speed and KEEP LEFT, with camera icons on signage. Repeat offenders should have their scooters confiscated and sold to help fund footpath maintenance.
