Just the other day, I had one riding down Clive's cct, Currumbin Waters in front of me. He had a helmet on, but was riding in the middle of the road, even though he saw me come out of my street and should of known I was behind him, he either didn't care or seemed to forget.Because he road in the middle of the road in front of me, swerving and seemingly unaware he was putting one knee up on the seat about to do a trick or something and had nearly stopped in front me to perform this trick/stunt! When I blew my horn to get out of my way from the middle of the road he turned around like he didn't know nor care I was there and he was in my road! Most members of my family have encountered similar incidents with possibly this same child. I feel child is the key word here, they are children on e-bikes that have no road sense and sometimes I guess not the peripheral vision to see other road users that have a licence and know the road rules!These children do not have licences, nor any kind of road safety nor do they know nor care about the road rules!
