Insurance Requirements: Riders should be required to obtain insurance to cover accidents or injuries caused to pedestrians. Strict Enforcement: Local authorities must actively monitor and enforce regulations to ensure rider accountability. Designated Zones: Clearly marked pathways for e-device users to separate them from pedestrian areas, reducing the likelihood of collisions. By adopting these measures, we can protect pedestrians while promoting responsible and safe use of electric mobility devices.
