E-Scooter & Electric Bike Submission

Qld, or at least the southeast, seem to treat these as toys. I'd like to see tough fines for both rider and parent/s. Underage, no helmet, modified etc"

My wife & I live at Mooloolaba and regularly walk the shared pathways along the coast – down to Caloundra...

I refer to E-Scooters & E-Bikes as "Whispering Death" a name given to Allied WW11 Mosquito bombers who came and left before the death & destruction was seen. E-scooters/bikes scare me at times – often travelling at speeds exceeding the road speed limits...and on footpaths and/or the roads. Coming up behind us without warning and passing at speed – often with two or three young people on them – all without helmets. I have seen many on roads passing cars – riders of all ages with and without helmets. Helmets will not save them if hit by a car!

- May we suggest Qld Transport find out how other states police them and consider how best we might manage them here. NO CHILDREN RIDING E-SCOOTERS!
- Banning public rentals is a start. (Bikes and Scooters).
 However, the sheer convenience of this mode of local transport may outweigh general bans.
- Dedicated pathways is not economic.
- Fitting all scooters & bikes with warning bells may help.
- Banning their use on public roads with severe fines for riders & parents plus, if riders are underage, banning them for a time period from using scooters. .
- Registration of all e-scooters & e-bikes. Plates & fees plus mandatory third party insurance.
- Laws for policing and civil courts to be clearly defined & enforced. Magistrates to be educated or re-educated!
- Kids should not be immune from penalties nor should parents.
- It should go without saying to introduce E-scooter/Bike rules & guidance into school programs primary & secondary children.
- I do not think they should be readily available to anyone but should be restricted to people over the age of 16. Plus no extra pax as we see so often two or three on a scooter and bike. None with helmets. I was young once and felt I was 'bullet proof' I learnt I was not!
