The legislation governing the use of e-bikes/scooters is not able to be enforced due to:

- 1. The electric motors being easily modified to mean that the maximum speed is simply overridden. (Check Youtube for the many examples illustrating how to alter/disconnect throttle.)
- 2. There is no evidence that many riders have formal learning of road rules. It is not a requirement for PMD users to undergo training.
- 3. The rate of flouting of current rules (speeding, helmet wearing, obeying road rules) indicates that it is impossible for the current numbers of police to monitor riders.

If a PMD has a motor (petrol/diesel/electric) then it is for road use and the PMD must be **registered and insured**, the driver must be **licenced** and **insured**.

There is no place for these vehicles on footpaths or in pedestrian only areas.

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
