Whilst there are laws governing the use of emobility devices on the roads, there appears to be a lack of compliance to these laws by users for those with personal emobility devices. The pay-per-use devices have geofencing built in which implicitly governs their speed within certain areas. These geofencing rules should probably be applied across all devices in use including personal devices.

I'd rather see emobility devices utilised on designated roads than footpaths similar to pedal bikes. Most users travel at excessive speeds along footpaths and endanger foot pedestrians in doing so. if a footpath is to be used then it should be split use and designated as so to limit the potential for collision.
