I have a knee and I struggle to get up hill and require assistance. The current power restrictions make it difficult. If an illegal e-mobility is found being used on the street or paths the police impound them not to be returned to the owner. Heavy penalties to the sellers if they misrepresent the legality of the bike. Allow e-bikes that are currently illegal to be used if the following apply:oThey are limited to 60kmh strict conditions are appliedoThey are registered and have number platesoThey have indicators, stop lights lightsoAny one using them require a e-mobility license (needs to be introduced) or a motor vehicle license.oChildren from 16 can apply for a e-mobility license by completing an intense on line learning course with an exam.oHeavy penalties apply and loss of license if you do not comply with the laws.
