
# Inquiry into e-mobility safety and use in Queensland

INQUIRY INTO E-MOBILITY SAFETY AND USE IN QUEENSLAND

#### Submission

We wish to express our strong views regarding the safety, use, and regulation of e-mobility devices in Queensland, for the following reasons:

**1** Sale and Use of Illegal E-Mobility Devices

- Many e-bikes and e-scooters are being sold as high-speed, derestricted "off-road" vehicles, yet they are regularly used on public roads.
- These vehicles effectively operate as illegal motorbikes on Queensland roads.
- Retailers, Individuals and parents are not taking responsibility for selling and purchasing the use of these illegal vehicles.

### 2 Safety Risks

- Riders—often children—are operating these vehicles at dangerously high speeds while wearing only bicycle helmets.
- The brakes and frames of these bikes are not designed to handle such speeds, significantly increasing risk.





• It is alarmingly easy to find instructions online (e.g., YouTube) that show how to derestrict these devices.

# **3** Proposed Solutions

- Tighten laws to allow <u>only</u> the sale of pedal-assist e-bikes no derestricted throttle only options
- Ensure all e-bikes and e-scooters are sold in a speed-restricted form. Required to have a licence if purchasing for off road usage.
- Introduce stronger design standards that make it far more difficult for devices to be derestricted.
- Strengthen enforcement around the sale and use of these vehicles, make the fines more substantial.

### Impact on Small, Law-Abiding Businesses

- As a small local business, we are disadvantaged by this situation:
  - We sell legal, registered motorbikes (e.g., mopeds limited to 50 km/h) that require registration fees of up to \$600 per year in Qld. Unlike other States like NSW who heavily subsidies this registration fee to encourage less cars on the roads.
  - Meanwhile, illegal e-bikes capable of speeds of up to 90 km/h are being ridden on the road without registration or CTP insurance and compliance costs.
- We believe lowering moped and scooter registration fees would encourage more people to choose legal, safer alternatives over illegal e-bikes.
- The issue with mostly children riding them is the bigger issue here and safety for all is the most important point to make.
