As a resident from a regional community in Queensland I am very concerned about all the big solar installations, Battery Energy Storage Systems, wind turbines, and hydro projects popping up everywhere. The community is not happy about these developments because we fear it will damage the environment, contaminate soil and water, and cause noise and visual pollution. Basically, we don't want to be surrounded by these installations. Our pristine mountain ranges are facing destruction on a level I never believed could be possible to install foreign owned, inefficient and intermittent wind turbines. Wildlife in these areas are being destroyed and even if they do survive the destruction from the installation period they will not be able to continue to exist near the turbines due to the noise, lights and vibrations. Surely this Queensland Government does not want to be the Government in charge during the period of unquestionably the largest environmental destruction being undertaken by foreign companies (at tax payers expense) on Australia soil.We are living in areas of prime agricultural land being covered in large scale solar projects in areas of extreme weather events. They have ignored the requirement of screening and without community consultation have changed from fixed to rotational panels causing glare issues to neighbours. As a regional resident on acreage we are required to adhere to many regulations and we aim to always improve our land and waterways, protect our environment and wildlife. Please stand by your regional residents and don't sacrifice us on the alter of the ideological "green energy dream" that is being proven not to work throughout the world.
