Planning (Social Impact and Community Benefit) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2025

Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the draft Planning (Social Impact and Community Benefit) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2025, which includes proposed amendments to the *Brisbane Olympic and Paralympic Games Arrangements Act 2021*. As a co-host and key delivery partner of the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games (the Games), the City of Gold Coast welcomes efforts by the Queensland Government to streamline Games governance and infrastructure planning while ensuring appropriate consideration of economic, social, community, environmental and First Nations outcomes.

The City has made a significant commitment to the successful delivery of the Games. The scale of operational impact, investment and risk involved is comparable to, if not greater than, our role in hosting the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games. In this context, we consider it essential that the City is appropriately represented in decision-making forums and that the enclosed proposed amendments are adopted.

The following table outlines proposed amendments to the Brisbane Olympic and Paralympic Games Arrangements Act 2021, with additional drafting in red and supporting justification.

Attachment 2 – Items for clarification

The following items require further clarification.

Section	Items for clarification
Chapter 3A, Part 4 – Use of necessary games infrastructure	The City requests clarification of the identification of infrastructure intended to be prescribed by regulation (as it relates to the definition of <i>'necessary games infrastructure'</i> , section 53DB of the draft Bill) as this will have bearing on future obligations under proposed new section 53EB.
Chapter 3A, Part 5 – Village infrastructure charges.	The draft Bill provides that the Minister may impose a infrastructure charge (a village infrastructure charge) on the owner of the land on which all or part of the village is located. Proposed section 53ED stipulates that a regulation may prescribe matters such as:
	 (a) development for, or a use of, a village, to which part 2 applies in relation to which a village infrastructure charge may be imposed under this part;
	 (b) necessary games infrastructure for which a village infrastructure charge may be imposed under this part;
	 (c) the amount of a village infrastructure charge, or the way the amount of the charge must be worked out;
	(d) the entities to which a village infrastructure charge may be payable.
	The City requests the following:
	 the Minister release the contents of the regulation for consultation with the City;
	 the Minister consults the City on the proposed calculation methodology of the infrastructure charge to be included in the regulation (for example, will it be by reference to an adopted charges resolution or some other regime);
	 the Minister ensures that the City is an entity that can recover charges under the regulation; and
	 any infrastructure charge that the Minister imposes on behalf of the City is agreed upon by the City prior to the giving of the notice under the regulation.
Relationship with <i>Land</i> <i>Act 1994</i> (Qld)	It is understood that the proposed amendments <u>do not</u> override the requirements contained in the <i>Land Act 1994</i> (Qld), in particular those contained in Chapter 3, Part 1. Clarification is sought about how these requirements are to be reconciled with the draft Bill to ensure efficient delivery of authority venues, other venues and villages.
	By way of reference, it is noted that section 78(2) of the <i>Major Events Act</i> 2014 (Qld) expressly refers to the <i>Land Act</i> 1994 (Qld), Chapter 3, Part 1 as not being applicable to activity or works captured by that section.
