Property location.

We wish it to be known that we have lived and worked on this property for the last 43 years and in that time we have carried a reasonable amount of timber treatment at considerable cost and personal effort. We would also like to inform you that all areas that treated 20 to 30 years ago or more are desperate need of re treatment as a result of regrowth with a significant increase in population. It should also be noted that these areas had been treated previously as evidenced by the long dead trees still bearing axe marks.

We are firmly of the belief that the restrictions on vegetation management as proposed in this legislation will eventually reduce the stocking rate on this property to the extent that it will no longer

be a stand alone viable operation..

With these restrictions being imposed state wide there will be less economic activity at local level, and also have a negative effect on the national economy as much of QLD agricultural produce is exported.

We would hope that your committee will make some recommendations to the Government that will reduce the proposed restrictions on land managers and allow Qld to remain a productive state.
