We are a young profitable family business located in the Murweh Shire in South West Queensland and it is due to our passion and respect for our land and good management practices such as selective clearing that we have a healthy biodiversity of ecosystems consisting of animals, birds, insects, grasses, shrubs and many trees. If we are restricted in managing our land, as the new laws will do, unnatural thickening and encroachment will leave our land and business unviable. We want the opportunity to drought proof our business for a sustainable future which includes the responsible management of our Mulga Lands. We cannot do this with constantly changing legislation leading to uncertainty and confusion.

Self-Assessable Codes have been very useful and more cost effective than lodging applications. Science based self-assessable codes help us to carry out the routine vegetation management practices necessary to sustainably deliver our products. These codes help us to ensure that trees and grass stay in balance, avoid soil erosion and feed animals in drought.
