We take great care of our property, trees, habitat & pastures that allow us to stay viable so we can care for our land. If we are not viable some one else will purchase our property & probably will not take the care that we do. If the 'Family Farm' can not survive the multi nationals will soon acquire & consolidate property's.

I have a couple of comments to make to this committee.

We have family members who live in the Mulga country
so I do understand how this bill will effect the viability
of their business. My son-in-law is a very careful operator, & it
is in his interest to lay the trees over & keep them alive, this lets
sunlight onto the ground allowing the cattle & sheep to self feed.
I have seen the thickening of the Mulga country, &
sensible management is vital to the biodiversity. Country with no
sunlight reaching the ground grows no grass, & no seed, to support the seed eating
birds & small mammals (which are under great pressure from feral cats
& dogs).

We have been drought declared for 5 years & I know, without mulga harvesting, there would be many thousands of dead cattle. I wonder if the urban population know & understand where their food comes from, if the Ag industries are unviable no one will be out in the regions producing food & fibber.

I now live in Toowoomba, some of the time, & am horrified by developers being allowed to removing ALL trees from development sites
