When vegetation management laws were introduced in Queensland on freehold title, it greatly reduced the value and also the future production and increased income without any compensation.

Vegetation management laws on freehold title in Australia was the greatest government sponsored theft from property owners ever perpetrated in this country. Many landholders who were greatly affected by these laws, spent large sums of money free holding their properties.

Private property was confiscated during the Russian Revolution.

Vegetation Laws are tantamount to part confiscation of freehold title.

Farmers throughout Australia are managing the environment, fires, feral animals and introduced weeds at their own expense on behalf of the Australian people.
