Submitter Comments:

1. To stop the RSPCA Inspectorate to be able to prosecute. Prosecutions need to follow legal process and go through either Queensland police or an independent committee who can remain unbiased and keep the focus on criminals of animal welfare rather than witch hunting and illegal seizures. To separate the Animal inspectors from the RSPCA altogether. The rspca is supposed to be for all animals big and small to educate assist and provide support where needed.
