Hello,

On Monday the [REDACTED] our house was broken into see police report
[REDACTED]

The thieves were in their teens. They were from Toowoomba. I do not know how or why they selected my house for attention. One of the thieves had 60 offences.

There were 3 of them. One waited in a stolen car while the other 2 split and broke into my house and my neighbours. The thief who entered my house was looking for house keys and car keys. He was unsuccessful in finding any but caused us \$150 damage in the process.

The other thief was able to gain entry and steal my neighbours car keys and house keys plus purses and wallets.

The thieves made off with my neighbours 2 cars and the third stolen car they arrived in. Later on they abandoned one car, stopped in nearby [REDACTED], broke into a house and stole a BT50.

So far I have not heard from the police on whether or not they caught the robbers. I handed the police over a video which was a compilation of all the video camera footage both external and internal I was able to extract from our security system.

The current laws are not working and these guys seem to be getting away without facing the consequences of their actions. Change is need to hold this class of criminal responsible and accountable for the actions.
