No. 7 Priority VICTIM SAFETY IN EDUCATION & REFERRAL SERVICES1. VICTIMS REMAIN AT SCHOOL- SAFETY PLANS & OUTCOME: (Victims no longer lose their Human Right to education in Australian schools.)a) When any student has assaulted another student or teacher in the first instance, it must be made mandatory for schools to REPORT to police, and a referral made to an online education facility made MANDATORY.b) When any student offends against another outside of the attending school, the police must REPORT to the school, to maintain VICTIM SAFETY, providing the student/teacher victim a Human Right to education after crime.2. OFFENDERS REGISTERED WITH EDUCATION DEPARTMENTS IN ALL STATES VIA QPS (Disclosure to Society)a) Sexual Offenders must be registered with QPS if they are current students. b) Offending students are not able to go to school and must be charged. Federal collaboration between existing stakeholders will reduce future risk at 'the next school'.When an offence or charge is presented to the school, a safety plan must be issued and executed,
