



# Estimates Committee A

## 2009

### Report No. 1 to the Legislative Assembly

---

#### Introduction

The Legislative Assembly appointed Estimates Committee A on 3 June 2009, in accordance with Standing Order 167(3), to investigate and report on the proposed expenditure contained in the Appropriation (Parliament) Bill 2009.<sup>1</sup>

On 14 July 2009, the committee conducted a public hearing to take evidence about the budget estimates from Mr Speaker and his advisors. A verbatim transcript of the committee's hearing can be accessed at:

Prior to the public hearing, the committee provided Mr Speaker with twenty questions on notice about the estimates for his portfolio. Mr Speaker provided responses to all the committee's questions.

The committee considered the estimates referred to it by using information contained in:

- Budget papers;
- Answers to pre-hearing questions on notice;
- Evidence taken at the hearing; and
- Additional information given in relation to answers.

Mr Speaker's responses to the committee's pre-hearing questions together with the minutes of the committee's meetings are included in a volume of additional information tabled with this report.

#### Legislative Assembly and the Parliamentary Service

The Legislative Assembly of Queensland consists of 89 Members who discharge a range of important legislative and constituency responsibilities. The Parliamentary Service established in accordance with the *Parliamentary Service Act 1988* provides administrative and support services to the Legislative Assembly.

The following table taken from the Appropriation (Parliament) Bill 2009 compares the appropriations for the Legislative Assembly for 2008-09 and 2009-10.

Budgeted capital expenditure for 2009-10 is \$4.13 million.<sup>2</sup>

#### Budget highlights

According to the Service Delivery Statements, the budget highlights for the Legislative Assembly for 2009-10 include:

- Establishing, resourcing, and administrative support for the new parliamentary committee system;
- Coordination and delivery of official community activities to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Queensland Parliament in 2010;
- Improvements to building infrastructure within the parliamentary precinct;
- Replacement and upgrade of certain office and computer equipment in electorate offices and the parliamentary precinct; and
- Relocation of a number of Member's electorate offices as a result of the 2008 electoral redistribution.

#### Issues raised at the public hearing

Issues the committee raised with Mr Speaker at the hearing on 14 July include:

- The security audit of electorate offices;
- Security of the parliamentary precinct;
- Changes in budgeting for the parliamentary committee system;
- The energy efficiency rating of the air-conditioning upgrade for the parliamentary precinct;

- Additional information on the community engagement activities of the Parliamentary Service;
- The establishment of a Speaker's Advisory Committee;
- The details of the official ceremony, swearing-in the Governor;
- How the Queensland Parliament has engaged and supported other parliaments in our region over the past year;
- Problems with the plumbing in the parliamentary precinct.

## Recommendation

The committee recommends that the proposed expenditure, as detailed in the Appropriation (Parliament) Bill 2009, be agreed to without amendment.
