The President took the chair at half-past 4 o'clock, and opened the proceedings with prayer.

**GOLD EXPORT DUTY REPEAL BILL.**

On the motion of Captain O'CONNELL, the house resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the purpose of considering this bill in detail.

The several provisions having been agreed to in that amendment, the house resumed, and, the report having been adopted, the third reading was fixed for the next day.

**MESSAGES FROM THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.**

The following messages, borne by the hon. the Colonial Secretary and the hon. the Attorney General, were received and read :—

"The Legislative Assembly have this day agreed to the Joint Standing Rules and Orders sent to them by the Legislative Council for their concurrence on the 28th instant."

Captain O'CONNELL then moved that the Standing Orders adopted by this House be printed and presented for approval to his Excellency the Governor, which was agreed to.

"The Legislative Assembly having this day passed a Bill 'Intituled A Bill to limit the number of persons holding office under the Crown who, under the Constitution Act, 17 Vic, No. 41, may be declared capable of being elected members of the Legislative Assembly,'" begs now to present the same to the Legislative Council for its concurrence.

On the motion of Captain O'CONNELL, the bill was ordered to be printed, and the first reading fixed as an order for the following day.

**GOVERNOR'S SALARY BILL.**

On the motion of Captain O'CONNELL, the house resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the purpose of considering the above bill in detail.

The clauses having been passed without amendment, the house resumed, and the report having been adopted, the third reading was fixed as an order for the following day.

**MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR.**

The following message from his Excellency the Governor was received and read :—

"The Governor lays before the Legislative Council a copy of a letter which he has received from Captain Denham, of the Royal Navy, in reply to his letter forwarding the resolutions of the house, embodied in their address of the 14th ult.

"Government House."

Captain Denham's letter was ordered to be printed on the motion of Captain O'CONNELL.

The house adjourned at 5 minutes to 5 o'clock until half-past 4 o'clock the next day.
