The President took the chair at twenty minutes to five, and opened the proceedings with prayer.

**PRIMARY EDUCATION BILL.**

On the motion of Captain O'CONNELL, the President left the chair, and the house resolved itself into a committee of the whole to consider the bill. After much desultory conversation, the Chairman reported the bill with amendments, and the adoption of the report was fixed to stand an order for to-morrow (this day.)

**DISQUALIFICATION OF OFFICERS' BILL.**

The house having resumed,

Captain O'CONNELL moved that the Disqualification of Officers' Bill be read a third time.

Motion put and passed.

Captain O'CONNELL then moved that the title of the bill be :—" A Bill to limit the number of persons holding office under the Crown, who, under the Constitution Act, 17 Vic. No. 41, may be declared capable of being elected members of the Legislative Assembly."

Question put and passed.

Captain O'CONNELL next moved that the bill be returned to the Assembly with message from the Council signifying their approval thereof without alterations.

Question put and passed.

The house then adjourned at twenty minutes to eight until half-past four to-morrow (this day.)
