Question put and passed.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFRESHMENT ROOMS.

Captain O'CONNELL next moved, pursuant to notice—"That the President, J. F. McDougall, Esq., and the Mover, be appointed members of the joint committee for the management of the Refreshment Rooms, and that such appointment be signified to the Legislative Assembly by message, requesting that it will be pleased to nominate a like number of members from its body, with a view to give effect to the 144th Joint Standing Order."

Question put and passed.

PARLIAMENT BUILDINGS' COMMITTEE.

Captain O'CONNELL next moved, pursuant to notice—"That the President, J.F. McDougall, Esq., and the Mover, be appointed members of the Joint Committee for the management and superintendence of the Parliament Buildings, and that such appointment be signified to the Legislative Assembly by message, requesting that it will be pleased to nominate a like number of members from its body, with a view to give effect to the 144th Joint Standing Order."

Question put and passed.

PRIMARY EDUCATION BILL.

On the order of the day being read, for the adoption of the report, Captain O'CONNELL moved that the printing of the report not having been finished, the order be discharged, and stand an order of the day for the following Tuesday.
