DISCONTINUANCE OF STATE-AID BILL.

A message was received from his Excellency the Governor announcing that he had been pleased to assent, on behalf of her Majesty, to the above Bill.

GRAMMAR SCHOOLS BILLS.

On the motion of Captain O'CONNELL, the report of the Committee on the Grammar Schools Bill was adopted by the House, and the third reading of the bill fixed as an order of the day for Tuesday next.

ADJUSTMENT OF ACCOUNTS WITH NEW SOUTH WALES BILL.

On the motion of Captain O'CONNELL, this bill was read a third time, passed, and ordered to be transmitted with a message to the Legislative Assembly.

There being no other business on the paper of the day, the House adjourned at twenty minutes to five o'clock till half-past four on Tuesday next.
