The President took the chair at half-past four, and read prayers.

GRAMMAR SCHOOLS BILL.

On the motion of Sir. C. NICHOLSON, the house resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the purpose of considering the amendments made by the Legislative Assembly in this bill.

The amendments, which were of a merely verbal character, were passed without discussion.

The house having resumed, the PRESIDENT reported the adoption of the amendments.

Sir. C. NICHOLSON moved that the bill be returned to the Assembly with a message expressive of the concurrence of the Council in the bill.

The motion was put and passed.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

Mr. GALLOWAY moved that leave of absence from the house be granted to Mr. McDougall for three weeks.

Leave granted accordingly.

GUNPOWDER AND WAR-LIKE STORES EXPORT REGULATION BILL.

On the motion of Sir. C. NICHOLSON, the house resolved itself into a committee of the whole to consider this bill.

The several clauses were passed, with one or two slight verbal alterations, the house resumed, and Sir. C. NICHOLSON moved that the third reading should stand.

THIRD READING.

On the motion of Sir. C. NICHOLSON, the following bills were read a third time and passed:— The Electoral Lists Collection Abolition Bill, the Unoccupied Crown Lands Occupation Bill, and the Tenders Regulation Bill.

The house then adjourned.
