APPOINTMENT OF THE HON. G. ELIOTT AS COMPANION OF THE ORDER OF ST. MICHAEL AND ST. GEORGE.

The POSTMASTER-GENERAL laid upon the table of the House, copy of a despatch from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, which was read by the Clerk as follows :-

"Downing street, "11th February, 1871.

" (Queensland, No. 6.)

"SIR,-I have received Colonel Blackall's Despatch, No. 96, of 29th November, reporting the appointment of Mr. Gilbert Eliott, the late Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, to be a mem-ber of the Legislative Council; and I am glad to learn that the Legislature will thus continue to have the benefit of his high character and experience.

"I have had much satisfaction in recommending to Her Majesty to mark Her appreciation of Mr. Eliott's long and honorable service by ap-pointing him a Companion of the Order of St. Michael and St. George.

The Hon. H. B. FITZ said it afforded him great pleasure to congratulate his honorable friend, Mr. Eliott, on this occasion, more especially as he was a member of the Council. He felt that honorable members would also congratulate themselves in having the benefit of that honorable gentleman's great experience to solve any difficult questions that might arise.

The Hon. G. ELIOTT thanked honorable members for their kind congratulations. It was most gratifying to him as a member of that House to receive them. He felt grateful to the memory of their late lamented Governor, who had recommended him to this distinction. His thanks were also due to the Secretary of State, for suggesting to Her Majesty that this great honor should be con-ferred upon him. He would only repeat his thanks for the kind way in which the announcement had been received.
