'I rise on a matter of privilege. This is the second day in a row when private members' business has been severely restricted. It is clear that it is part of the ongoing cover—up by the Government to protect the Minister for Public Works and Minister for Housing. We are going to be denied our two-minuters.

Mr Speaker, I understand that you have indicated to the Leader of Opposition Business that there are another five Ministers to make ministerial statements this morning, which means that private members' business in this place is being censored and gagged by the group of political cowards sitting opposite who are perpetuating a cover—up.'
