1 MEETING OF THE HOUSE

The House met at 9.30am pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (Honourable R K Hollis) read prayers.

2 STATEMENT BY SPEAKER – FLYING OF ABORIGINAL FLAG AT PARLIAMENT HOUSE

The following statement was made by Mr Speaker—

'I have received the following letter from the Member for Western Downs (Mr Littleproud)-

"Dear Mr Speaker

It has come to my attention that you have instructed that the Aboriginal Flag is to be flown from the flagpoles within the precincts of Parliament House. I can only presume you believe this gesture will assist reconciliation.

I write to express my fear that this decision may, in fact, be counterproductive.

I firmly believe many people support reconciliation, but their support is in danger of being replaced by resentment – a resentment of action they find offensive and/or unacceptable. I believe your decision to fly the Aboriginal Flag at Parliament House is just such an action.

I respectively request you reconsider your decision."

I therefore bring to the attention of the House correspondence forwarded to my office from the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet headed "National Reconciliation Week – 27 May 2000 to 3 June 2000. In part, that correspondence reads—

"For the past two years it has been the practice to mark National Reconciliation Week through the flying of the Aboriginal flag and the Torres Strait Islander flag.

... agencies are advised that the Aboriginal flag and the Torres Strait Islander flag may be flown with the Australian national flag to acknowledge National Reconciliation Week."

This accompanied advice from the Queensland Government's Protocol Branch instructing that the flags be flown in accordance with the NAIDOC Week policy, which reads in part—

"... the Aboriginal Flag may be flown ... in combination with the Australian and Queensland Flags. However, where there are fewer than three flagpoles, it should not replace either of these flags."

I trust that this answers the Honourable Member and others who object to the flying of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags.'

3 PETITIONS

Mrs E Cunningham, from 270 petitioners, requesting the House to separate the Government Ministries of Police and Corrective Services.

Mr Davidson, from 372 petitioners, requesting the House to instruct the Minister for Transport to reduce the speed limit along David Low Way through South Peregian Beach from the present 80 kph to the 60 kph limit which already applies north through Peregian Beach and Marcus Beach.

Dr Kingston, from 1,183 petitioners, requesting the House to strongly oppose the forced transfers of Inspector Mal Churchill and Sergeant Chris Sidey for the alleged lack of professionalism.
