The Assembly met at 9.30am, pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (Honourable R. K. Hollis) read prayers.

Mrs Lavarch from 225 petitioners requesting the House to provide traffic lights, including pedestrian crossings, at the existing Petrie roundabout located at the junction of Dayboro Road/River Street/Gympie Road/Anzac Avenue/Whites Road, Petrie in order to: allow pedestrians to safely cross these major roads; improve pedestrian access to local shops & services; and reduce traffic congestion at peak hours.
