With reference to the former Labor State Government commitment in 2008 to provide Queensland's four year old children with access to high quality kindergarten education, provided by qualified educators in the year before school—

 - (2) How many eligible children are this year enrolled in a quality education program in the north coast region of which the Morayfield State electorate is part?
