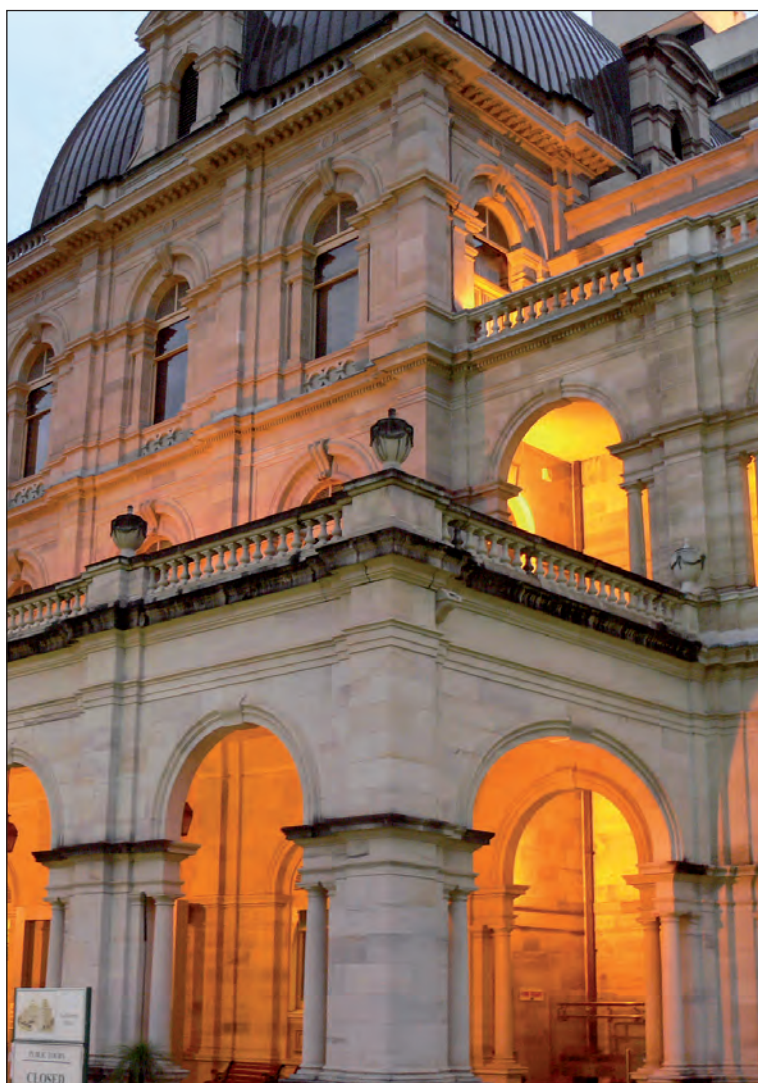

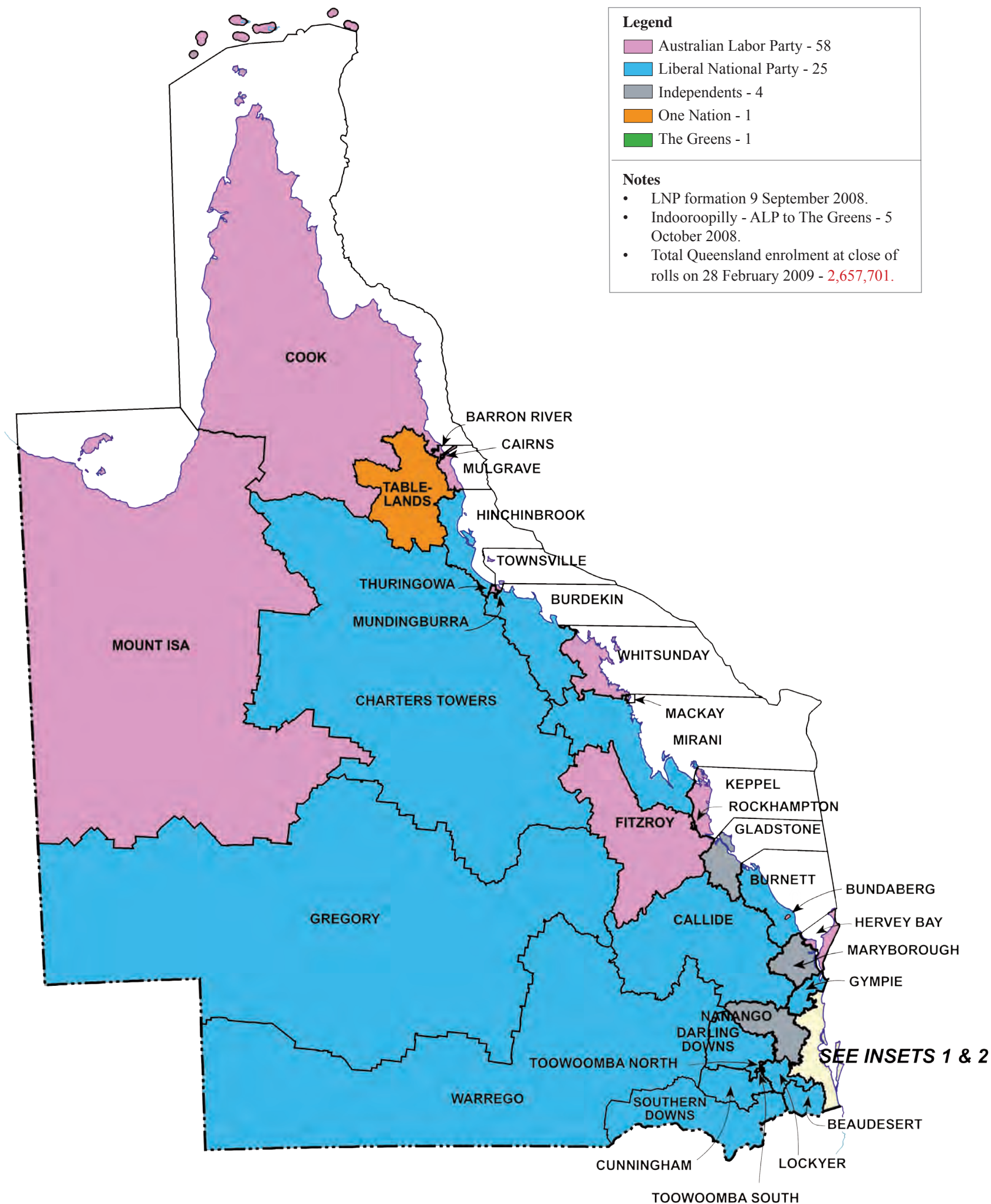

Front Cover

Parliament House is one of Queensland's main heritage buildings and has been the location of the Queensland Parliament since the building's completion in August 1868. From 1860 to 1868, Parliament met in the Old Convict Barracks in Queen Street which were situated across from the present-day Myer Centre. This photograph depicts the Porte-Cochere of the main George Street entrance. This was only added in 1982, despite having appeared on the original plans for the building.

HER EXCELLENCY MS PENELOPE WENSLEY, AO
25TH GOVERNOR OF QUEENSLAND FROM 29 JULY 2008

Penelope Wensley was born in Toowoomba and educated at Penrith High School in NSW and the Rosa Bassett Grammar School for Girls, London. Returning to Queensland for her university studies, she completed a Bachelor of Arts degree with First Class Honours at The University of Queensland in 1967. Following graduation she fulfilled a long-held ambition to join the Australian Foreign Service, selected as the only woman in the 1968 intake of diplomatic cadets.

From 1968 to 2008, she pursued a highly distinguished career as a diplomat, representing Australia in a wide range of overseas posts and senior policy positions. Among her prestigious diplomatic appointments, she serviced as Australia's Ambassador to the United Nations for seven years, in both Geneva and New York, as Ambassador for the Environment, High Commissioner to India and Ambassador to France.

In 1994, The University of Queensland named her as the first woman Alumnus of the Year, and also awarded her an Honorary Doctorate. In 2001, she was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO), for her distinguished contribution to Australia's international relations. She has also been awarded an Honorary Doctorate by Griffith University.

Ms Wensley and her Nambour-born husband, Stuart McCosker, a fellow UQ graduate, were married in Brisbane in 1974. They have two adult daughters, both lawyers. Ms Wensley's interests include reading, especially biographies, family history, Queensland history and all aspects of the visual and performing arts.



HER EXCELLENCY MS QUENTIN BRYCE, AC
GOVERNOR OF QUEENSLAND 29 JULY 2003 - 29 JULY 2008

Ms Quentin Bryce was educated at Moreton Bay College, Brisbane, and later at the University of Queensland where she graduated with the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws. In 1965, she was one of the first Queensland women to be admitted to the Queensland Bar.

From 1968 to 1983, Ms Bryce taught in the Faculty of Law at the University of Queensland.

In 1984, Quentin Bryce was appointed inaugural Director of the Queensland Women's Information Service, Office of the Status of Women, Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet. In 1987, she became Queensland Director of the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission. From 1988 to 1993, Ms Bryce served as Federal Sex Discrimination Commissioner, and in the period 1993 to 1996, she was founding Chair and Chief Executive Officer of the National Childcare Accreditation Council. From 1997 to her appointment as Governor of Queensland in 2003, Quentin Bryce was Principal and Chief Executive Officer of The Women's College within the University of Sydney, New South Wales.

In recognition of her service to the community, particularly women and children, Ms Bryce was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia in 1988, and elevated to a Companion of the Order of Australia in 2003. She was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Laws by Macquarie University (New South Wales) in 1998, and an Honorary Doctorate of Letters by Charles Sturt University (New South Wales) in 2002.

Quentin Bryce and her husband, Michael, were married in 1964. They have two daughters and three sons, and five grandchildren.

On 5 September 2008 Ms Bryce was sworn in as the twenty-fifth Governor General of Australia.

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Regional Parliament

The Far North Queensland sitting of Parliament in Cairns (28-30 October 2008) was the third time in its history that the Parliament met outside of Brisbane. The sitting was an opportunity for Far North Queensland students and the general public to experience democracy in action. Over 5,200 people attended over the three days of sittings, including almost 2,000 school students. The Wednesday evening Question time session was attended by 755 people and was also interpreted into Auslan sign-language for members of the Far North Queensland deaf community who were in attendance.

National Week of Deaf People

The Queensland Parliament participated in the National Week of Deaf People on 17 October 2007, by having Question Time interpreted into Auslan sign language for visiting members of the deaf community. The event was jointly organised by Deaf Services Queensland (DSQ), the Parliament's Community Engagement Unit and MPs David Gibson and Carolyn Male.



Wind Yarn

In May 2007, John Pene-Formosa was commissioned as the Parliament's first artist-in-residence to produce an official didgeridoo for the parliament. The 'Wind Yarn' is a didgeridoo that symbolises reconciliation in Queensland. The 'Wind Yarn' was unveiled on 15 November 2007 and is displayed alongside the Parliament's Mace and is used on special ceremonial occasions.



Indigenous Liaison Officer Appointment

Speaker Mike Reynolds congratulates Mr Brett Nutley on his appointment as the Queensland Parliament's Indigenous Liaison Officer in January 2008. The Queensland Parliament was the first Australian parliament to appoint an Indigenous Liaison Officer.



Abergowrie Youth Parliament

The Abergowrie Youth Parliament was held on 22 April 2008 at Abergowrie College in North Queensland. This event saw 90 secondary students from Abergowrie College, Ingham State High School and Gilroy Santa Maria College debate a range of youth issues. The Abergowrie Youth Parliament was jointly presided over by local Members of Parliament, Mike Reynolds, Member for Townsville and Andrew Cripps, Member for Hinchinbrook.

Flag Raising Ceremony

Speaker Mike Reynolds was joined by members of the Brisbane Council of Elders and representative of Torres Strait Islanders, Mr Thomas Sebasio, to watch as the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags were hoisted for the first time in front of Parliament House on 22 May 2007. Under Speaker Reynolds two important initiatives in the recognition of Indigenous peoples in the Queensland Parliament were implemented. The first was that the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags were permanently flown along with the Australian and Queensland flags in front of Parliament House and also located within the Legislative Assembly Chamber. Secondly, the traditional owners of the land on which the Queensland Parliament stands are now acknowledged at the start of each sitting day.



Online Broadcast

The online broadcast of proceedings of the Queensland Parliament commenced in June 2007. Staff from the Parliamentary Reporting Service remotely operate cameras located in the Parliamentary Chamber and broadcast the footage live over the Parliament's internet site.

It is now a key feature of the Parliamentary Record to celebrate significant events in the course of a Parliament by the inclusion of a photo collage of important milestones and events, such as the regional sitting of Parliament held in Cairns 28-30 October 2008.

Under Speaker Reynolds, two initiatives were implemented in relation to Parliament's recognition of Indigenous peoples of Queensland. Firstly on the 22nd May 2007, the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags were permanently flown along with the Australian and Queensland flags in front of Parliament House and also located within the Legislative Assembly Chamber. Secondly, the traditional owners of the land on which the Queensland Parliament stands are now acknowledged at the start of each sitting day.

In addition, in this edition, information about Shadow Ministries has been enhanced.

Updating of the material for the Record of the 52nd parliament has been a combined effort of staff of the Parliamentary Library and Community Engagement Unit. Particular thanks are owed to Kalimna Hawkins and Tim Moroney of Community Engagement, and Melissa Cook, Roslin Bailey and Eve Francis as well as Research and Information staff of the Parliamentary Library.

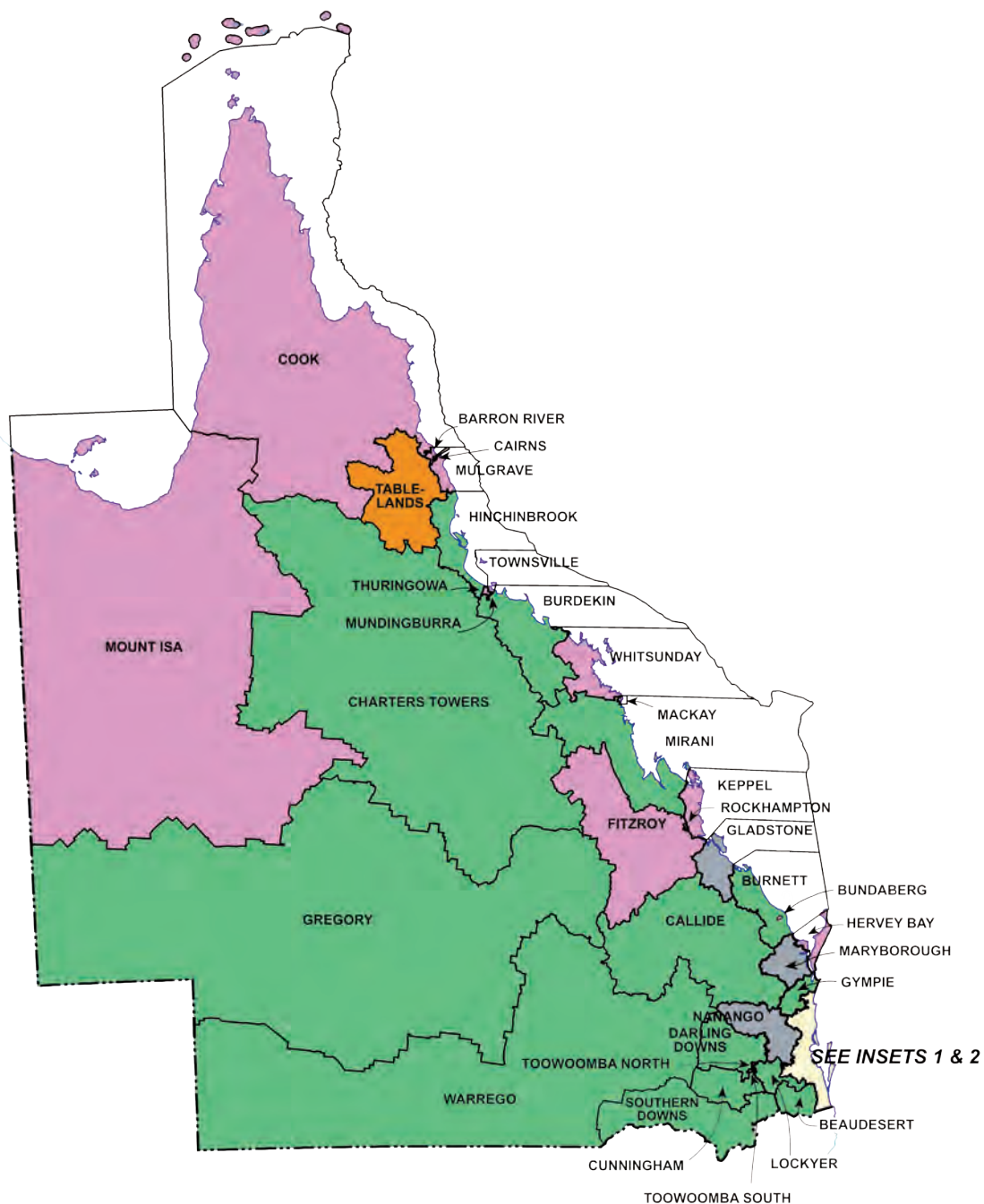

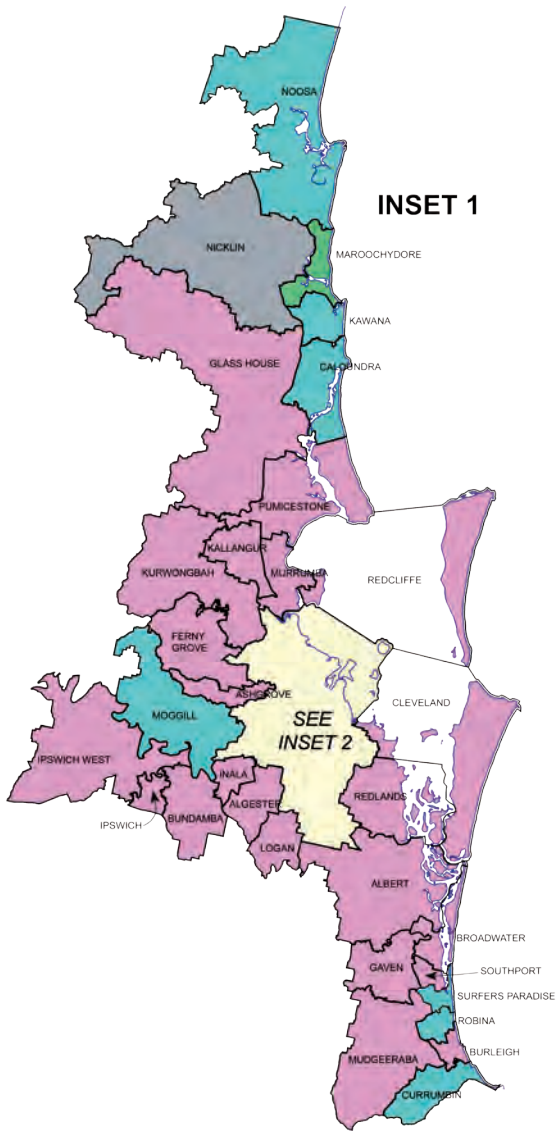

As at BEGINNING of 52nd Parliament





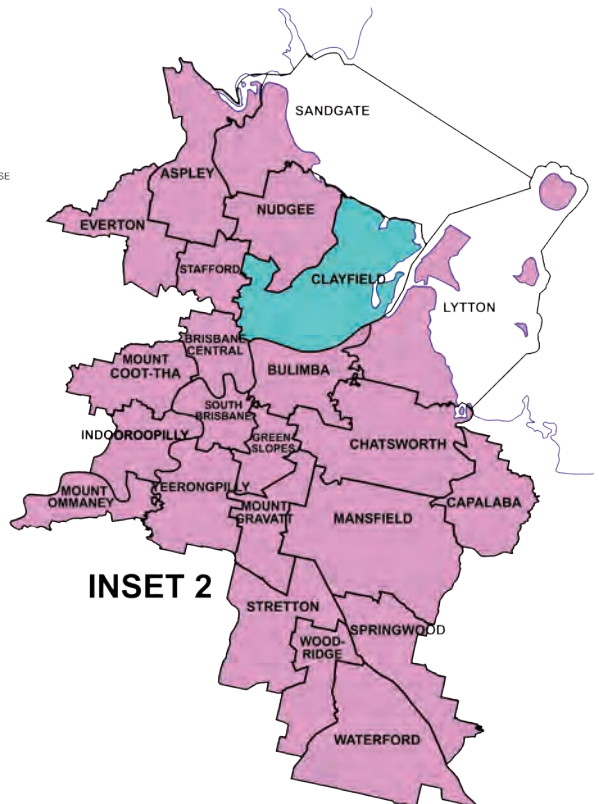

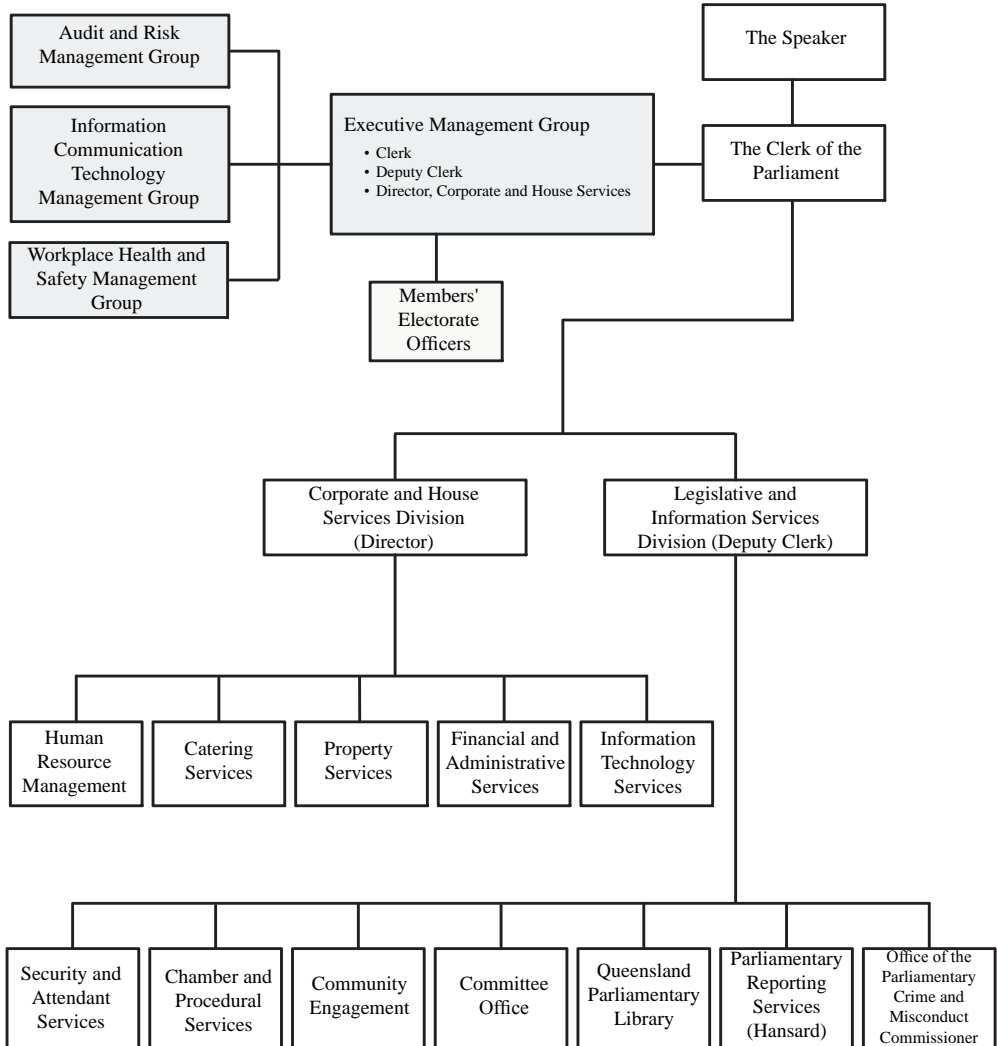

The idea was taken up by the state governments, with Queensland being the last one to create the position of Parliamentary Secretary. In Queensland's case, the Borbidge/Sheldon National Liberal government created the position for three Parliamentary Secretaries by a motion in the Parliament, which was ratified by an Executive Council proclamation in February 1996. Later, in April 1996, the position of Parliamentary Secretary was legislatively recognised by the *Constitution (Parliamentary Secretaries) Amendment Act 1996* which provided formal status in the *Constitution Act 1867* (now covered by the updated *Constitution Act 2001*, Sections 24 – 26), and four other relevant Acts.

On 30 August 1898 the Australian Labor Party (ALP) accepted the official position of Parliamentary Opposition in the Queensland Parliament. Prior to 1898, loose coalitions of interests were opposed to the Governments of the day. Because of their changeable voting patterns, it is difficult to categorise them as a definitive Parliamentary Opposition. It will be noted that the ALP has had a continuous history as a party, whether in Government or Opposition. However, the non-Labor parties demonstrate a history of changing titles or changing alignments. Where the non-Labor Opposition leader has remained the same, but the party or alignment has altered, the pertinent dates of service are given.

- 1982 October - Parliament moved back into the original Legislative Chamber after restoration of Parliament House completed.
- 1985 *Electoral Districts Act 1985*: 89 electorates in four zones.
- 1988 *Parliamentary Service Act 1988*. Established Parliamentary Service Commission and role of the Clerk as the Chief Executive Officer of the Parliamentary Service.
Parliamentary Members' Salaries Act 1988: Members' salaries linked to House of Representatives salaries.
- 1991 *Electoral Districts Act 1990* (Date of assent 15 April 1991): 89 electorates, zones abolished, optional preferential voting. Provided for electorates less than 100 000 km² in area, tolerance of 10% of the average number of electors, and for electorates over 100 000 km², the sum of the number of electors and 2% of the area (in square km) should be within 10% of the average number of electors.
- 1992 *Electoral Act 1992*: provided for the same method of distribution that was used in the 1991 redistribution.
Parliamentary Papers Act 1992. Tabled documents may be copied without incurring any civil or criminal liability.
- 1995 *Parliamentary Committees Act 1995*: Abolished the Parliamentary Service Commission

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and placed administration of the Parliament under the control of the Speaker. Provided legislative basis for Statutory Committees of the Legislative Assembly.

- 1996 Parliamentary Secretaries appointed to assist particular Ministers.
- 1999 July redistribution of Electoral Districts, the first by a Commission under the *Electoral Act 1992*. Of the 89 electorates, most changes were in the growing urban and coastal urban communities. Persisted with tolerance of 10% of the number of electors for electorates under 100,000 km², and retained five electorates of over 100,000 km².
- 2000 19 October. It was resolved at a meeting of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (Qld Branch) that a Member of the Legislative Assembly should be known as MP rather than MLA.
- 2001 *Constitution of Queensland 2001*: Consolidated Queensland's constitutional legislation. *Parliament of Queensland Act 2001*: Provides for the powers, rights and immunities of the Legislative Assembly; appointment of its officers and committees; qualification for membership of the Legislative Assembly.
- 2002 On 8 August, the Queensland Parliament approved a process allowing petitions to be sent to Parliament electronically. This form of petitioning is known as an 'e-petition'.
- 2002 From 3-5 September, the Queensland Parliament sat in Townsville, the first time it had sat outside Brisbane in its history. More than 8,000 people visited the Parliament, over 50% being school children from schools as far away as Yam Island, Mount Isa and Rockhampton. A government subsidy assisted students further than 200 kms from Townsville.
- 2004 On 18 June, new Standing Rules and Orders, which took effect from 31 August 2004, were adopted by the Queensland Parliament.
- 2005 Centenary of Queensland Women's Suffrage.
- 2005 From 4-6 October, the Queensland Parliament sat in Rockhampton, marking the second occurrence of a regional sitting in the history of the Parliament.
- 2007 A single repository database for all papers tabled in the Queensland Parliament was developed, which is accessible on the Queensland Parliament's website.
- 2008 February. Record of Proceedings replaced the *Queensland Parliamentary Debates* (Hansard), being the full text of what is said in the House, the proceedings of the House and an electronic gateway to all papers tabled in the House.
- 2008 August. Redistribution of Electoral Districts, the second by the independent Commission established under the *Electoral Act 1992*. The number of electorates remained at 89. Major changes were made to 16 seats, and new names introduced. Persisted with tolerance of 10% of the number of electors for electorates under 100,000 km², and retained five electorates of over 100,000 km².
- 2008 From 28-30 October, the Queensland Parliament sat in Cairns, only the third time in its history that it has sat outside Brisbane.

STATE-SPONSORED REFERENDUMS

Queenslanders have participated in seven State-sponsored referendums since the establishment of the Queensland Parliament. The first was in 1899 and the last in 1992. Only two of the seven questions have been resolved in the affirmative. The seven State-initiated referendums are outlined below:

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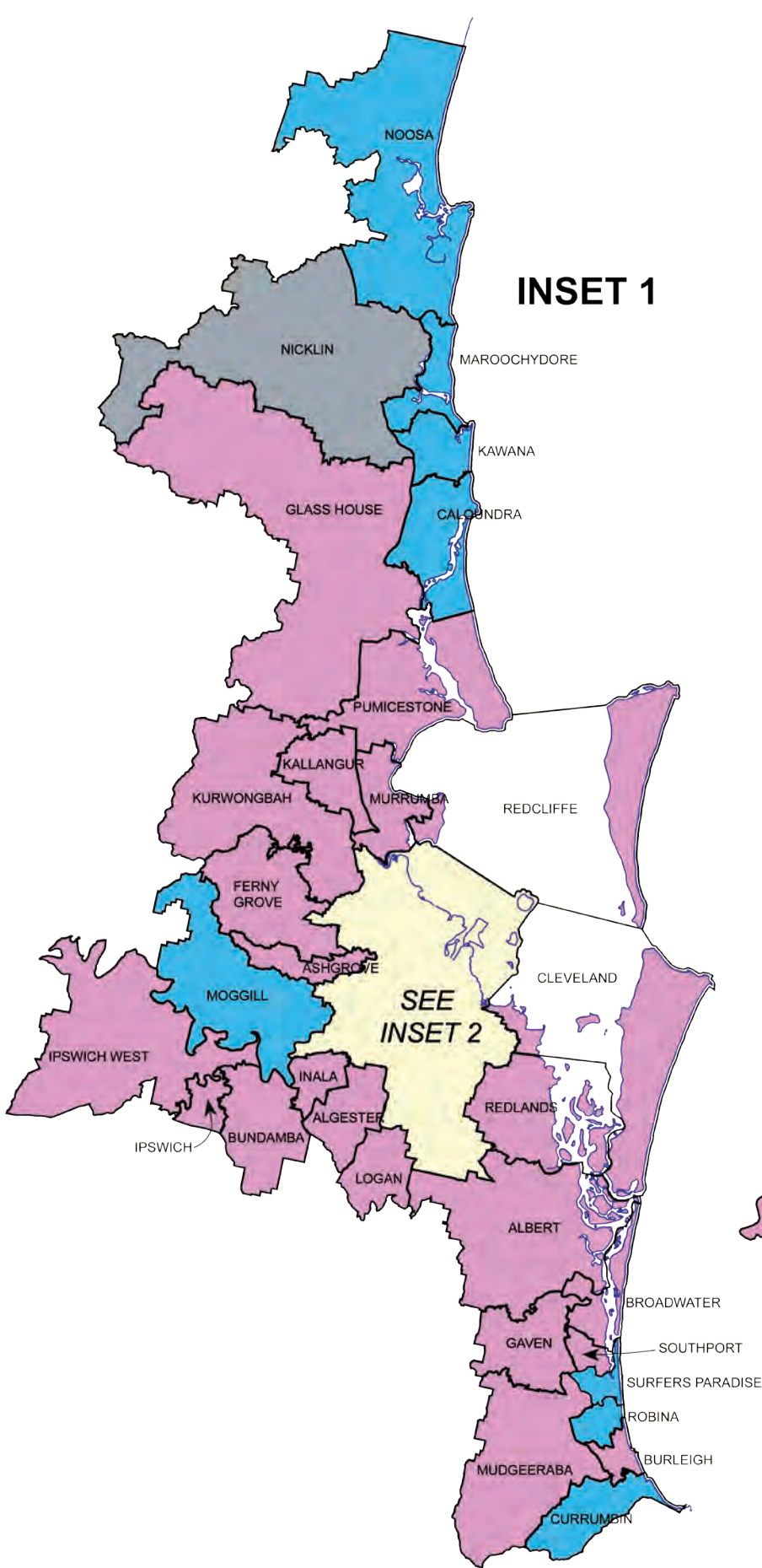
