COMMENTS BY MEMBER FOR SPRINGWOOD

Mr KNUTH (Burdekin—ONP) (11.04 p.m.): Last night the member for Indooroopilly spoke against the moronic comments made by the member for Springwood against the elderly generation of this House, not to mention the outrageous attacks he made on firearm owners in Queensland, which gave the impression that anyone who owns a firearm will eventually turn that firearm upon his wife. What a stupid and ridiculous statement to make about the hundreds of thousands of firearm owners in this State.
