CENTRAL QUEENSLAND TIDIEST TOWN AWARD

Mr MITCHELL (Charters Towers—NPA) (7.23 p.m.): I was very pleased to hear this week that Clermont was awarded the Central Queensland Tidiest Town Award. Clermont is in the southern part of my electorate, some 400 kilometres south of Charters Towers. It was announced by the Keep Australia Beautiful Council on Monday of this week. The council applauded Clermont for its proactive civic and community pride and its extraordinary tidiness—for which I can vouch, and very much so. The award is sponsored by the Ergon Energy Central Queensland Regional Division Tidy Town 1999. Clermont is now in contention for the Queensland Tidy Town of the Year, and I am sure that all central Queensland will wish Clermont well.
