Mrs MILLER (Bundamba—ALP) (7.15 p.m.): Bundamba is an electorate on the move. We are a vibrant community that celebrates diversity, multiculturalism, our successes and our support for education and training. Recently I attended Kruger State School and was very pleased to induct the school captains and vice-captains of the school. This memorial plaque is in memory of the men and women of the Royal Australian Air Force and it was unveiled by Wing Commander John McGarry of 38 Squadron from the RAAF base at Amberley.
