Open Data Apps Awards

 **Mr STEVENS** (Mermaid Beach—LNP) (3.41 pm): We have reached an important milestone in our open data revolution project, and that is the closing date of the Premier's open data apps awards competition, which is today. The Premier's awareness and encouragement initiative has seen the awards receive about 50 excellent nominations for the competition, which closes today.

This exciting stage of the open data revolution has given us the greatest opportunity to engage with the community at large, industry and business stakeholders, non-government organisations and individuals who wanted to be part of this exciting opportunity and development of a variety of innovative apps for the inaugural Premier's awards. The apps will be judged in four categories: public transport, social services delivery, economic benefits for Queensland and an open wildcard category, with final nominations to be in today—proving that there are many, many talented people out there who got their nominations in by today.

We have seen some very creative, revolutionary, innovative and exciting proposals and concepts submitted for the Premier's open data apps competition. I would like to thank all participants who have provided conceptual proposals for taking the time, for their hard work and for some going out on a limb in developing and putting forward their submission.
