VACANCY IN SENATE OF COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA: ELECTION OF SENATOR

Mrs FRECKLINGTON (Nanango—LNP) (3.12 pm): It is with great pleasure and pride that I rise to support the motion moved by the Premier to endorse the nomination of Joanna Lindgren as the new Queensland senator. I believe that this understanding of Indigenous education will assist Joanna to become a very strong and valuable member of the Australian Senate. I pass on my congratulations and sincere best wishes, and with that I support this nomination.
