**MR M CRANDON** ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)—

#### QUESTION:

Will the Minister provide a list of each train currently in QR's CityTrain fleet together with its (a) fleet ID (if yet assigned), (b) model name (e.g. SMU200), (c) date it entered service (or forecast date of service entry), (d) forecast retirement date and (e) the same information for any new trains ordered but yet to enter service (including the 20 trains currently in procurement)?

#### **ANSWER:**

I thank the Member for Coomera for the question.

The Queensland Rail CityTrain fleet comprises 149 three-car units and the Interurban Multiple Unit (IMU) and Suburban Multiple Unit (SMU) fleet range in age from 10 to 26 years.
