MR M BERKMAN ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON B MICKELBERG)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the timing for delivering the bus priority corridors in the SEQ RTP 'SEQ Frequent Public Transport Network 2041' on page 53 (the SEQ RTP bus priority corridors) and the Creating Better Connections for Queenslanders report which states, at page 29, that the SEQ RTP bus priority corridors 'will be implemented progressively over the next 10 years'—

Will the Minister advise (a) if the department has commenced detailed planning to deliver the proposed bus priority corridors on the following by 2031 (i) Sir Fred Schonell Dr, (ii) Moggill Rd (Kenmore to Indooroopilly), (iii) Jubilee Tce Bardon, (iv) Latrobe Tce Paddington, (v) Musgrave Rd Red Hill, (vi) Kelvin Grove Rd, Kelvin Grove, (vii) Lutwyche Rd (Federation St to Truro St), (viii) Kingsford Smith Drive, (ix) Montague Rd West End, (x) Ipswich Rd (Woolloongabba to Moorooka) and (b) what funding has been allocated to support the planning and delivery of these bus priority works?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for the question.

I am advised that the SEQ RTP was released in 2021 under the former Labor Government who did not deliver any of the bus priority corridors listed by the Member.

I am further advised that in 2023, the Department of Transport and Main Roads did complete initial investigations into options for the Ipswich Road (Woolloongabba to Moorooka) corridor, which is largely in the electorate of the Miller. As the Member for Miller was Minister for Transport and Main Roads at the time, the Member may wish to approach him for further historical information about this work.

Musgrave Road, Red Hill planning is being undertaken as part of the Waterworks Road Passenger Transport Study in consultation with Brisbane City Council (BCC). This study is expected to be completed in late 2025.

No detailed planning has been undertaken by the department for the other corridors listed. However, it should be noted that most are controlled by BCC, and I am unable to provide advice on what work they may have undertaken.

For information on the Crisafulli Government's priorities for bus priority projects, I would direct the Member to the *2032 Delivery Plan*. This includes the eastern and northern bus corridors, for which planning work is underway.
