1 MEETING OF ASSEMBLY

The Assembly met at 2.30pm pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (The Honourable J Fouras) read prayers.

2 PETITIONS

The following petitions, lodged with the Clerk by the Members indicated, were received—

Mr Laming, from 84 petitioners, praying that action be taken to waive the \$10 fee to be paid by pensioners for the new disabled parking stickers.

Mr Laming, from 711 petitioners, praying that the Parliament of Queensland will take action to ensure (a) that extra police and vehicles are provided in the Mooloolaba area; (b) that the Mooloolaba Police Beat remains adequately staffed; and (c) that resources are allocated in such a way as to ensure that unacceptable behaviour is eradicated.

Mr Littleproud, from 4,465 petitioners, praying that the Parliament of Queensland will address flaws in the juvenile justice system by legislating for stronger penalties for juveniles who reoffend and that action be taken to make detention centres secure.

Mr Livingstone, from 100 petitioners, praying that immediate action be taken to halt the Eastlink powerline project.

Mr Livingstone, from 20 petitioners, praying that the statutory prohibition on the production and usage of cannabis be continued.

Mr Livingstone, from 50 petitioners, praying that an open inquiry be conducted into upgrading the public bus service in the Nerang area.

Mr Livingstone, from 18 petitioners, praying that a referendum of ratepayers be conducted in areas affected by the proposed amalgamation of Albert and Gold Coast Shires and (a) that results of this referendum be binding on government; and (b) that the referendum wording include a *no opinion vote*.

Messrs Livingstone and Szczerbanik, from 7,707 and 67 petitioners respectively, praying that action be taken to ensure that the proposed amalgamation of the Albert Shire and Gold Coast City does not proceed.

Mr Quinn, from 3,207 petitioners, praying for action to be taken to ensure that the proposed Robina Hospital proceeds.

Mr Robertson, from 623 petitioners, praying for the installation of red light cameras at the intersection of Beenleigh and Mains Road, Sunnybank.
