- 1 PROCLAMATION CONVENING PARLIAMENT: The House met at 10.00 o'clock a.m. pursuant to the Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor bearing date the Eighth day of February 1990, which was read by the Clerk as follows:-
- COMMISSION TO OPEN PARLIAMENT The Clerk acquainted the House that His Excellency the Governor, not being able conveniently to be present in person this day, had been pleased to cause a Commission to be issued under the Public Seal of the State, appointing the Honourable Wayne Keith Goss, The Honourable Thomas James Burns and The Honourable Terence Michael Mackenroth, Commissioners in Order to the Opening and Holding of the present Session of Parliament, which he then read to the House as follows:-
- MEMBERS SWORN Mr Goss produced a Commission under the Public Seal of the State, empowering him and two other Members of the House therein named, or any one or more of them, to administer to all or any Members or Member of the House the Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance to Her Majesty the Queen required by law to be taken or made and subscribed by every such Member before he shall be permitted to sit or vote in the said Legislative Assembly, -
- The Clerk informed the House that the Writs for the various Electoral Districts had been returned to him severally endorsed as follows:
- The Commissioners (The Honourable Wayne Keith Goss, The Honourable Thomas James Burns and The Honourable Terence Michael Mackenroth) having, together with other Ministers, been previously sworn in before His Excellency the Governor, then administered the Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance to all other Members present, viz:-
