MR LIVINGSTONE asked the Minister for Education and Minister for the Arts (Ms Bligh) -

QUESTION:

Will she provide a list of all completed capital infrastructure projects undertaken by the Government since July 1998 until 2004 as part of the Queensland Heritage Trails Network and Millennium Arts Regional Program, including the name of the project and the location?

ANSWER:

Since July 1998, the Government has completed 53 capital infrastructure projects in regional Queensland as part of the \$110m Queensland Heritage Trails Network (QHTN) and the \$15m Millennium Arts Regional Program (MARP).

The following table provides a list of all projects completed by the Government since July 1998 under these programs.
