Dr Flegg asked the Minister for Employment, Training and Industrial Relations (**Mr Barton**):

QUESTION:

With reference to the Government's *Breaking the Unemployment Cycle* suite of programs-

Will he detail for each program/initiative by State Electorate the

- (a) total funding provided
- (b) number of people assisted and
- (c) number of people that have found and sustained employment for 2001-02, 2002-03 and 2003-04 (reported separately).

ANSWER:

- (a) & (b) **Attachment A** provides a breakdown of funding and people assisted by State Electorate under programs administered under the *Breaking the Unemployment Cycle* initiative for the financial years 2001/02, 2002/03 and 2003/04 (data for the 2003/04 financial year is available to 31 March 2004).
- (c) The Department of Employment and Training records the number of people who obtain a job and this information is also contained in **Attachment A**.

Community Employment Programs

To determine if participants are obtaining sustained employment, participants who undertake Community Jobs Plan projects and Community Employment Assistance Program projects are surveyed three months after the completion of the project to determine whether the participant is in employment or training. In the case of these two programs, participants are resurveyed at 12 months after the completion of the project. Survey outcomes are not available by Electorate. Survey results from projects that completed in 2002 and 2003 are yet to be analysed.

For participants whose Community Jobs Plan project ended in 2001, 51% were in employment three months after completion and 60% were in employment 12 months after completion. For participants whose Community Employment Assistance Program project ended in 2001, 45% were in employment three months after completion and 59% were in employment 12 months after completion.

Employment Support Programs

In relation to apprenticeships and traineeships there are two major programs. The first is the Private Sector Employment Program where employers are paid incentives for taking on additional apprentices and trainees. These payments are made after six months of employment to ensure commitment from employers to ongoing opportunities for young people. No payments are made unless employers fulfil that requirement.

The second is the Public Sector Employment Program where independent agencies survey apprentices and trainees 12 months after completing their training.

The results are as follows:
