Mr RICKUSS asked the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice (Mr Welford) -

QUESTION:

With reference to the State Penalties Enforcement Registry - What is the total level of State revenue collected from speed camera infringements for each month for the last 24 months (reported separately for each month)?

ANSWER:

SPER (State Penalties Enforcement Registry) has been the most successful approach to collecting unpaid fines in our state's history. Since it was introduced in November 2000, SPER has collected over \$200M in payments from fine defaulters.

The monthly amounts (shown below) have no relationship to the total speed camera fines imposed in Queensland for that particular month. They are simply a record of how much revenue SPER has recovered from fine defaulters in that period.

The revenue collected from speed camera fine defaulters for the period March 2003 to February 2005 was, as follows:
