MR SEENEY ASKED THE DEPUTY PREMIER, TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR SPORT (MR MACKENROTH)—

QUESTION:

With reference to budgeted and approved maintenance projects for each department, agency and portfolio entity administered by him—

- (1) What maintenance projects are running behind schedule or have not been commenced or completed to date (reported separately according to name and location)?
- (2) For each of the projects listed in (1), what are the amounts expended to date and what level of expenditure is still budgeted to complete each project?
- (3) For each of the projects listed in (1), what are the revised completion dates and the corresponding reasons why?

ANSWER:

Treasury Department

Treasury has no major maintenance projects.

Sport and Recreation Queensland

The maintenance programs for Sport and Recreation Queensland and the Major Sports Facilities Authority each comprise three elements:

- Condition based maintenance – scheduled maintenance projects identified through regular assessments of the condition of buildings and facilities;
- Service based maintenance – scheduled servicing of major items of plant and equipment as per manufacturers' recommendations; and
- Unplanned maintenance – urgent or unavoidable items that arise and must be repaired as a priority.

Condition based and service based maintenance projects are on schedule for completion within the specified time frame for each item.

Unplanned maintenance (by its nature) is not scheduled, but rather is approved as the matter arises.
