**QUESTION:**

Mr HOBBS asked the Minister for Environment, Local Government, Planning and Women (Ms Boyle)—

For 2005-06 will she provide details on (a) the number of assets sold by the department and associated portfolio entities above \$1,000; (b) a description of each asset sold above the value of \$1,000 (c) the value each listed in (b) was sold at and (d) the method by which each asset listed in (b) was disposed?

**ANSWER:**

**EPA**

The Environmental Protection Agency sold/traded-in 11 individual assets for a value greater than \$1,000 during the 2005-06 financial year.

The disposal proceeds from the 11 assets totalled \$483,507. It should be noted that this amount is not all cash proceeds from the disposal of agency assets as, for example, the trade-in value on an asset is also recorded as disposal proceeds.

The following is a detailed listing of the various items disposed of:
