## Question on Notice No. 1385 Asked on 2 November 2006

MR DICKSON asked the Minister for Health (MR ROBERTSON)-

## QUESTION:

- (1) What is the number of people waiting for public health dental treatment broken down by (a) health district, (b) public hospital/other health services and (c) type of dental service provided?
- What is the waiting time list to see a public health dentist or dental technician broken down by (a) health district and (b) public hospital/other health services?
- (3) What preventative measures are being taken to reduce the demand for public sector dental services?

## ANSWER:

Queensland continues to provide the most comprehensive public dental service in Australia for adults and school aged children.

In 2006-07, the State Government will spend \$137.7 million to provide free public dental services for Queenslanders.

During 2005-06, approximately 555,000 occasions of service were provided to adult dental patients at a cost of \$90.5 million. The budget for 2006-7 is \$94.1 million.

Additionally, during 2005-06 approximately 640,000 occasions of service were provided to children through School Oral Health Services at a cost of \$41.9 million. The budget for 2006-07 is \$43.6 million.

This is an excellent result in an environment of oral health workforce shortages in Queensland and Australia.

- (1)&(2)Attached is a table which details the number of people waiting for unspecified care at the end of October 2006 by Health Service District and Clinic. This table includes waiting times for general care. Emergency dental treatment is provided within 24 hours.
- (3) Preventative treatment is provided as part of the oral health care given to eligible child and adult patients throughout Queensland, in addition to hygienist advice and care.

Queensland Health collaborated with Education Queensland to establish and implement the Smart Choices program to reduce the availability of high fat/high sugar foods in school tuckshops.

Queensland Health has also developed a range of oral health promotion information, education and training tools available for use by health professionals, carers of young children, teachers and the general community. Examples of current programs are:

- the Happy Teeth program Happy Teeth is a health promoting schools program
  which provides child care centre staff with the tools to incorporate oral health into
  the centres curriculum through classroom lessons, information home to parents and
  learning through action;
- Crocodile Smiles is an Indigenous community engagement program that was
  developed by the Cairns District Oral Health Service. The program focuses on the
  use of community engagement principles to promote the incorporation of oral
  health issues into general community health. The Cairns Health Service District is
  currently working on the final evaluation of the program with the aim of
  expanding the program for use in other parts of the State;
- water fluoridation resources a series of four water fluoridation resources have been developed and made available to health professionals, councils, schools, parents and the general community in an effort to increase the community's awareness and knowledge of water fluoridation and the oral health benefits of water fluoridation programs.

Queensland Health hosted the National Oral Health Promotion Steering Group in 2006. The role of the National Oral Health Promotion Steering Group is to facilitate Australian and New Zealand collaboration in oral health promotion for the progression of Action Areas related to health promotion within the National Oral Health Plan. Through this coordinated approach the steering group will work towards enhancing interstate resource sharing, facilitate health promotion strategic direction setting and identify and communicate health promotion good practice in the area of oral health.
