Question on Notice No. 169 Asked on 28 February 2006

MR MALONE asked the Minister for Emergency Services (MR PURCELL) -

QUESTION:

With reference to the Community Ambulance Cover charge, commonly recognised as the Ambulance Tax – Will he provide the following information for each year since its introduction (reported separately)

(a) a breakdown by item/program expenditure (reported separately) of how the revenue collected from this charge has been spent and

(b) whether it has been necessary for him to seek supplementary funding as a consequence of the collapse of the Queensland public health system; if so, how much has been sought and where is this funding budgeted to be spent (reported separately by item/program expenditure)?

ANSWER:

(a) The Community Ambulance Cover is not a tax. Therefore, to refer to it as the 'Ambulance Tax' is misleading. The CAC was a Beattie Government initiative to give all Queenslanders access to the world class ambulance services the QAS offer and to ensure that the QAS can maintain its reputation as a world class organisation.

Since its inception, QAS has invested \$311.8 million directly from the CAC to provide pre-hospital ambulance response service to patients who experience sudden illness or injuries requiring emergency medical care, emergency, non-urgent and specialised patient transport services, and related services. Related services include provision of community services, and safety and awareness programs.

(b) I have not sought supplementary funding as the Queensland Public Health System has not collapsed.
