MRS DESLEY SCOTT asked the Minister for Justice and Attorney-General (Mrs Lavarch):

QUESTION:

What assistance is being provided to refugees in the Woodridge Electorate in regards to legal services and family reunification?

ANSWER:

Legal Aid Queensland (LAQ) has a regional office in Woodridge. It is located at:

1st Floor, Woodridge Place Corner Ewing Road and Carmody Street Woodridge

The office is within walking distance of most government and community services, including both Access Inc and Multilink, the two refugee and immigrant services in Woodridge. The Woodridge LAQ office provides legal advice, legal information and legal representation in family law, civil law and criminal law areas. Both refugees and newly arrived immigrants access the Woodridge Legal Aid OfficeLAQ for advice and representation in these areas of law. As well, there is a strong network of preferred suppliers in the Woodridge area who conduct legal aid work on behalf of Legal Aid QueenslandLAQ in these areas of law.

Any advice sought by refugees specifically on immigration law and refugee matters, including family reunification advices, requires a migration agent to provide the advice and this is not a service offered by the Woodridge LAQ office. These clients are referred to the Refugee and Immigration Legal Service (RAILS) which is located at:

1st Floor, Boundary Chambers 170 Boundary Road West End

RAILS provides both a telephone (non Brisbane Metro clients only) and face-to-face legal advice service for refugees from 9.00 a.m to 5.00 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday.

Women's Legal Aid is a specialist unit of Legal Aid QueenslandLAQ and is also situated at the Woodridge Legal AidLAQ. office. Refugee and migrant women are a large proportion of the clients who use Women's Legal Aid. Women's Legal Aid also receives referrals from the Immigrant Women's Support Service in West End which provides support to non-English women experiencing sexual assault and domestic violence.

Legal Aid QueenslandLAQ offers a free telephone legal advice service on its 1300 05 11 88 number which can be accessed by any person in Queensland. RAILS can be contacted during its business hours on (07) 3846 3189.

Both the Woodridge Legal Aid OfficeLAQ and RAILS provide interpreter services if required.
