

**Question on Notice
No. 542

Mrs STUCKEY asked the Premier (Mr Beattie) -

QUESTION:

With reference to Question on Notice No. 271 of 2006—
How many development applications (reported individually) have been approved by local councils or the State Government in Queensland that are listed in the South East Queensland Regional Plan as being outside the urban footprint?

ANSWER:

Since the release of the Draft South East Queensland Regional Plan, the Office of Urban Management, as a concurrence agency, has approved three urban activities under Division 2 of the regulatory provisions.

The applications were:

- the relocation of a church (Brisbane City Council);
- a Child Care Centre and Local Store in Mt Samson (Pine Rivers Shire Council) - approved under minor and local character requirements; and
- extension to a medical centre at Purga (Ipswich City Council) - approved under minor and local character requirements.

Development applications for non-urban activities outside the urban footprint do not trigger assessment under the South East Queensland Regional Plan Regulatory Provisions.
